

## 7.1.1 - Measures initiated by the Institution for the promotion of gender equity during the year


The annual gender sensitization action plan conducted through Gender equality Club, 'Astitva'.

#### About the workshop-

The workshop "Are we really equal " was conducted by Akshara Foundation, in our college, Smt. Maniben M.P Shah Women's College of Arts and Commerce on 17th January 2023. It was organised by students of Astitva, the gender club.

The workshop started at 2.00 pm and ended at 5.45 pm.
